



School-Based Mitigation Measures

Each school administration will promote and ensure proper hygiene measures are in place throughout the school year. School administration will attempt to mitigate the risk of transmission of COVID-19 utilizing the following measures:



Procedure/Protocol	Detailed Information
Emphasis on Hygiene and Sanitization	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Administration will ensure that hand sanitizer and face coverings are available.• Administrators will place signage throughout building reminding students and staff to use proper handwashing procedures.
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• When possible, students will be physically distanced by at least 3 feet within the classroom as recommended by CDC Guidelines.• Administrators will spot check for physical distancing intermittently throughout the day.
Facial Coverings	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Facial coverings will be available at no cost to all individuals in each school's front office.• Facial coverings will be optional, but encouraged, for all students and staff.
Visitors	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• School administration will limit nonessential visitors from the school environment to prevent any additional COVID-19 exposure.• School administrators will approve any essential visitors during the school day. Essential visitors are defined as all MCPS employees or contract workers.• Essential visitors will be encouraged to conduct a self-screening of symptoms before entering the building and will be advised of COVID-19 mitigation strategies, such as social distancing and face coverings.
Notification	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If a Pre-K through 4 grade student is determined to be near someone who tested positive for Covid-19, the parent/guardian will receive notification from Maury County Public Schools.• In grades Pre-K through 12, Maury County Public Schools will supply information to local health officials to contact students who may have been exposed to Covid-19.• Asymptomatic and Symptomatic contacts must quarantine and confirmed positive cases must isolate pursuant to Tennessee Department of Health Releasing Cases and Contacts from Isolation and Quarantine guidelines and will be excluded from the school building pursuant to School Board Policy 6.403.
