


## Jared Jones

Jared Jones is a 2000 graduate of Hillsborough High School and is considered by most of the school's athletic staff as the most prolific athlete in the history of Raider Athletics.

He was four-year varsity letter winner in three sports: football, basketball, and track. No other Hillsborough High School athlete has accomplished this feat.

In football, Jared was a four-year starter. In his sophomore year he was selected to the All-Area and All-County Honorable Mention teams. He was also selected to the same teams in his junior year as well as the Honorable Mention All-State team. In Jared's senior year, he was selected to Tom Lemming's Pre and Post Season All-American Football teams. He was also rated as the sixth-best receiver in the East and was selected to the NJFCA Super 100 All-State Football team. At the season's end, he made the All-County, All-Area and All-State first teams. Prior to graduating, Jared had over 50 football scholarships offered to him.



In basketball, Jared was a four-year starter. In his senior year, he was selected to the first team All-County and All-Area teams and to third-team All-State. Jared was chosen to play in the North-South High School All-Star Classic and was selected as the Courier News Player of the Year. He also became a member of the 1000 point club. Jared was offered over ten basketball scholarships.

In track, Jared was a four-year varsity letter-winner. He ran in the 100, 200 and 400 meters, the 4x4 relays, the 400 hurdles, the 110 meter hurdle relay and the long jump. He holds the school record in the 200 meters. Jared made the All-County and All-Area track teams in his junior and senior years. He was offered over ten scholarships for track.



After high school, Jared attended Syracuse University on a full athletic scholarship. With the Orangemen, he was a four year letter-winner. He started as a wide receiver during his junior and senior years. During his senior year, he received the Duffy Daughtey Award and tied for sixth all-time on the reception list.

After college, Jared signed as a free agent with the Philadelphia Eagles.

Jared received many other noteworthy awards. He was a four-time recipient of the Paul Robeson Award, he made the Syracuse University's Dean's List his freshmen and senior years, and he participated in the Paul Robeson Performing Arts Academy where he was cast in several plays.

It is because of Jared's many honors and achievements that the Athletic Hall of Fame Committee is proud to induct Jared Jones into the Class of 2007 HHS Athletic Hall of Fame.
