

## Scott Robinson

Scott Robinson graduated from Hillsborough High School in 2001.

He excelled in football but his best sport was track and field. In football Scott was an outstanding wide receiver and played on the 2000 State Championship team. He was sought after by many colleges.

In track and field Scott had an exceptional career. In his last three years at Hillsborough he was named All County, All Conference, All Area and he was undefeated in his dual meets in the 100m dash.

As a sophomore, Scott also placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the State Sectional 100m hurdles and 6<sup>th</sup> place in the 100m dash.

In his junior year he was the State Sectional champ in the 4X400 relay, placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the State Sectional 110m hurdles and 5<sup>th</sup> in the 4X4 Group 4 meet. He also set the school record in the 110m hurdles with a time of 14.2 seconds.

But his senior year was by far his best. He was the 110m hurdle State Sectional champ, 3<sup>rd</sup> place at All Groups, and 2<sup>nd</sup> place at the Meet of Champions All Groups in the 110m hurdles. He set the school and county records in the 110m hurdles, was voted 2<sup>nd</sup> team All State and finished his high school career ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in the United States and 6<sup>th</sup> in NJ state history.

He continued his career at the University of Virginia where he was the ACC Conference meet scorer, a 4 year letter winner, ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in school history in the 60m hurdles and was on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Scott currently resides in Clarksburg, Maryland.
