Tim Rauch is a 2007 graduate of Hillsborough High School. As a Raider swimmer, Tim was a four-year varsity letter winner, the leading scorer on the team in points in his junior and senior years and the team captain in his senior year. He was an integral part of many Raider swimming championships. His teams were Skyland Conference Champions and Somerset County

Champions in 2005, Group 4 Central Jersey State Sectional Champions in 2004 through 2007 and Group 4 Public State Champions in 2005.

Individually, Tim had 10 Top 16 finishes at the NJSIAA Meet of Champions from 2005 to 2007. He recorded 11 Top 3 finishes at the Skyland Conference Championship meet and 9 Top 3 finishes at the Somerset County Championship meet. He was also 2-time Skyland Conference and Somerset County event champion. He is a former school record holder in the 500 Free, 200 Free Relay and the 400 Free Relay.

Tim also received many post-season awards. In 2005 he was selected to the 2nd Team All-Skyland Conference and 2nd Team All-Area. In both 2006 and 2007, Tim was selected to the 1st team All Skyland Conference, 1st Team All Somerset County, and 1st Team All Area.

After graduating from HHS, Tim went on to swim successfully at The College of New Jersey for four more years. In 2008, Tim earned the "Most Improved Swimmer Award" and in 2011 was named the team captain. Over his career at TCNJ, his teams won four straight Metropolitan Conference team titles.

Individually, Tim holds the school record in the 400 Individual Medley, breaking a 12 year-old record. He also holds the school record in the 1650 and 1000 Free, breaking a 9 year-old record. Tim qualified for the NCAA Division III Championships in three individual events and two relay events. He was an NCAA All-American, a 7-time New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) 1st team selection and 2-time NJAC 2nd team selection across all events. In his college career, Tim had eleven "Top 8" finishes at the Metro Conference Championships.
